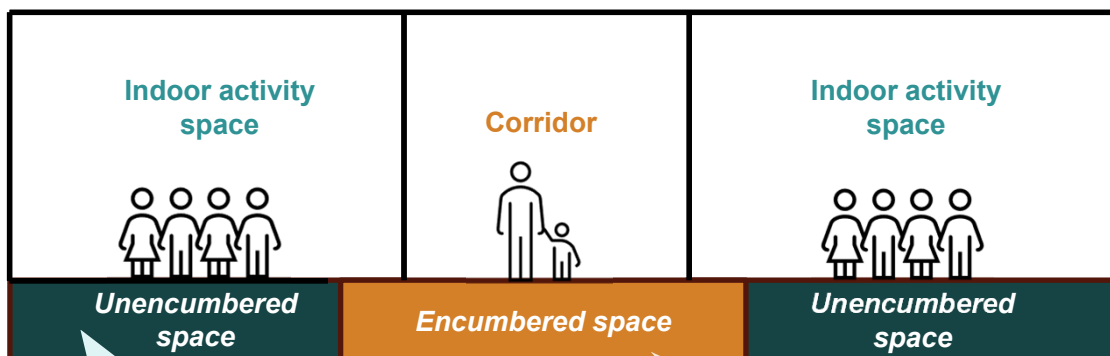

What is an unencumbered space? (1 of 1)

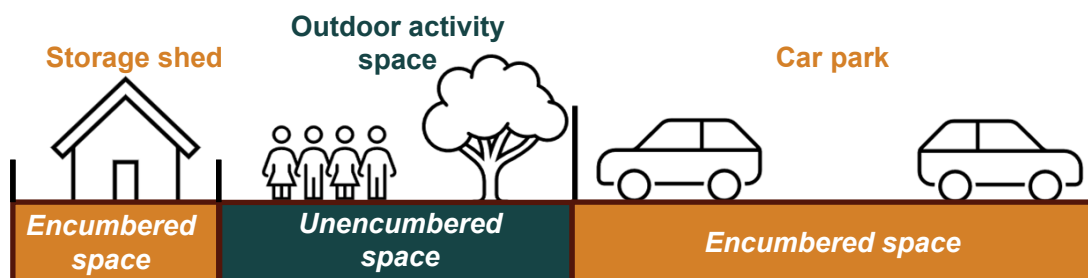
Indoor example of unencumbered space



'Unencumbered spaces' describe a space that is free from obstacles and can be used for different play and activities in a safe and comfortable way.

Corridors and doorways are for children and adults to move around. This means that they cannot be used as free play spaces and are considered an **'encumbered space'**.

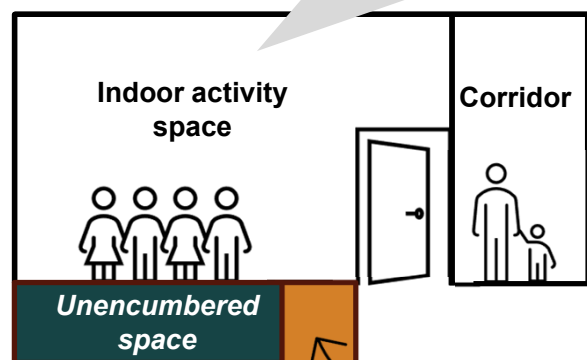
Outdoor example of unencumbered space



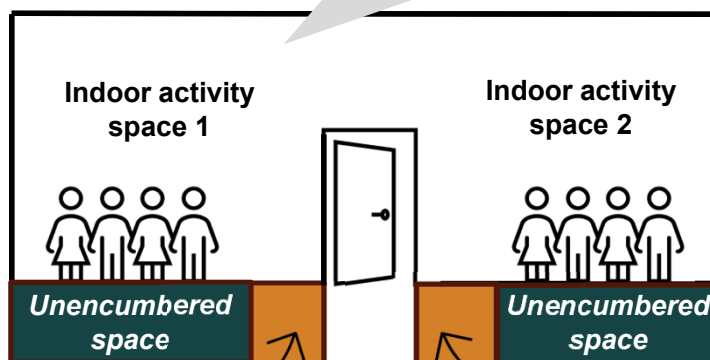
Doorways

If a doorway is attached to an unencumbered space, 1 square metre is deducted from the free activity space.

If a doorway is between 2 unencumbered spaces (such as 2 activity spaces), 1 square metre is deducted from each side of the door.
